

Report of the Ryedale Christian Council's Year: 2015 to 2016

Without a doubt it was the Conference that was the highlight of our year. We spent nearly 2 years in planning it and thanks to Tim Robinson the Bishop of Carlisle agreed to be our guest speaker. He is the person in charge of 'health' in the Church of England and infused a delightful, almost lighthearted approach, to very serious issues of Mental Health, Dementia, End of Life Care and Stress. Scripture Union books are distributed to every young person in our area who move up to secondary school.

We have had a fresh look at our Refreshment Tent at the Ryedale Show (this year on Tuesday 26th July) and are simplifying the way we do things. Helpers and cakes are always needed.

I do need to warmly thank all the members of the RCC for their faith filled enthusiasm and hard work. Especially to Ann Gray who has given many years as secretary; we congratulate Sue Binks on being ordained priest and much value her contribution to the Council. I am continuing as Chairperson, Les Helm as deputy, and we are very pleased to welcome Virginia Collinson as secretary. Mike fortunately is continuing in charge of our finances and Judith works valiantly and efficiently as Publicity and Rosemary as designer of all our publicity.
